
Journals - If you can support our FTP, please bring your journals to the meeting.

Sharing a simple quilting tip- always wash your wide backing as they shrink 3 to 4 inches and add a colour catcher.

ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTED THROUGH COMMUNITY OUTREACH (Part 3)



EarlyON Child & Family Centres are open to all families in Ontario—with three in Dufferin County. They offer free, high-quality programs for families and children from birth to six years old. For example, *Creating Understanding with Young Parents (CUP)* is a program that supports young parents (under 25) and their children to learn and develop while fostering confidence, self-esteem and attachment. They acquire knowledge and skills, and receive support in their daily lives while networking with other peer parents. A variety of

programs at the centres are drop-in, while others are scheduled with waiting lists-- which reflects the high need in the community.

DPQG – The Guild makes quilts for participants in the Infant and Toddler Time program. Some of our members make tops or complete the whole quilt as they are a smaller project--approximately 42x42 or larger. With cute fabrics, maybe a panel, these quilts are fun to do. ***Some baby quilt kits will be available at the March meeting.**




Choices Youth Shelter is a not-for-profit agency that provides a wide range of services to homeless youth in Dufferin. Since 2000, it has provided safe emergency housing for up to 30 days for youth aged 16 -24. Clients are enrolled in an independent living program which includes help with life skills, wellness, and nutrition. Referrals to other community organizations are made to support transition to a brighter and more productive future.

DPQG – The Guild donates quilts to the shelter located on Town Line in Orangeville. They are usually single-bed size, preferably in unisex colours. We've collected donations of personal care, winter wear accessories and gift cards at Christmas.

Creative Projects Mystery Quilt


Crossing Squares (7)



Unit 7


To make the pieces for Unit 7 you will need your pieces from Unit 2, Unit 5 and Unit 6.

Sew a Unit 2 piece to each side of a Unit 6 piece as shown.



Unit 2. Unit 6 Unit 2 Press seams towards Unit 2. Make 20

Sew a Unit 5 piece to the top and bottom of the combination above as shown. Press seams towards Unit 5.



This now becomes Unit 7. Need 20.

Vice President's challenge

The first (of many) Guild challenges - LOGO twist

Finished block to be 8" - Due at our in person meeting in March.

Our DPQG logo the Briar Rose in yellow on a field of turquoise blue replaced our original logo in 1997-98 and was designed by Kym Ranger. There are no thoughts to replace this logo but I want to see what our members can design in their own interpretation of our logo. Using ONLY the colours of the logo, design and sew your take. It can be thread painting, abstract, paper piecing, felted, crumb or scrap, it doesn't even need to look anything like the logo. The colours need to be from the logo - yellow, brown, turquoise, gold, and teal (or green if that's what you see in the logo) but otherwise the design is yours. You have until the March meeting to finish your block and bring it in. This should be a quick sew to get you into quilting mode for the winter and a fun way to try a new technique or try your hand at designing.

You may do more than one block, the more the merrier ! Blocks received will be used in a quilt.

I can't wait to see what you all come up with!


